

### ARE YOU DANCING UNINSURED? REAL FACTS ABOUT THE SQUARE DANCE INSURANCE PROGRAM

### THE BASICS:

Every square dance organization needs General Liability and Accidental Medical Expense coverage while conducting and sponsoring dance activities. As closely as safety rules are followed, accidents can and will happen. This insurance program, especially designed for USDA dance groups, provides Accident Medical insurance, which helps protect club members from financial loss due to a covered accidental bodily injury, and Liability Insurance, which protects the club and its members and association officials from financial loss due to unforeseen incidents which may develop into litigation against members and dance organizations.

### PERIOD OF COVERAGE:

The insurance year is January 1 through December 31. Coverage becomes effective for individual clubs under the policy on the day the application and premium for insurance is received by the USDA Insurance Coordinator. There is no pro-rate provision. This is necessary due to the large administrative expense of maintaining different policy dates.

### OUR DANCE FACILITIES LIABILITY INSURANCE:

Limits of Protection: \$1,000,000 combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence (subject to a \$100 property damage deductible per claim) while participating in scheduled and sponsored dancing activities. \$100,000 limit for damage to premises rented to you.

### DANCER MEDICAL INSURANCE WHAT IS COVERED?:

Accidental bodily injury sustained by an insured person while participating in dancing activities sponsored and supervised by a recognized club or organization

### WHO IS COVERED?:

Club members will be insured while participating in any regularly scheduled and sponsored dancing activity worldwide, including group travel (10 or more club members) in a vehicle commercially licensed for transportation of passengers and operated by a person holding a valid operators license for such vehicle, while being transported to or from a covered dancing activity.

### LIMITS OF COVERAGE:

\$10,000 Usual and Customary Accident Medical Expense, including Dental (\$10,000), Accidental Death Benefit (\$10,000), Accidental Dismemberment Benefit (loss of one hand, one foot, sight of one eye).

### BUT I HAVE MY OWN MEDICAL INSURANCE!

Coverage provided is excess to any other valid and collectible medical insurance covering the same accident. Coverage provided for covered medical expenses incurred within 52 weeks of the accident up to \$10,000 for all eligible expenses as stated in the policy.



### OUR DANCE FACILITIES WHO IS COVERED:

The club and its members while participating in club or organization-sponsored and supervised dancing activities. Liability coverage applies in the United States, its territories or possessions, and Canada.

### USDA INSURANCE COORDINATORS NOTES

WOW, a lot of action for USDA insurance since I last wrote about what was happening with our insurance program. I have just finished enrolling the last batch of enrollments I received from one state and with those enrollment all requested certificates have been delivered!!! This is a first in the 12 years I have been handling USDA insurance. This is wonderful progress for our program and much of its success goes to our insurance chairmen who "jumped on board" and participated with enrolling their clubs through our renewable portal. The developers will be reviewing our system and making some changes they see need to be done and, also, some of the suggestions that have come from you as you used the program.

With all that being said, here are a few reminders. You need to keep submitting in written form the class rosters. This is important and submissions should be done ASAP after the class begins; insurance coverage is a bonus given to us by Markel for our students and not to insure the class ASAP does a disservice to our students. You can add additional members to a club through the portal by following the same procedures as you used when enrolling members. Once done, send a copy of the new roster (which you receive immediately after ending the submission) to me along with payment. You can, also, request new certificates of insurance through the portal by following the same procedures as when you entered your club's facility needs in the facility section. One important point is not to delete any information under facilities as this information needs to remain there for when enrollments are done in 2020. You will not get the new certificate as quickly as you get a new roster but if you let me know you have entered the request, I will send as quickly as I can manage.

I encourage any insurance chairmen who have not tried the portal to give it a chance. Using it next year for enrollments will be a breeze as you will only have to update the information that is shown. However, keep in mind that use of the portal is optional and someone will always be available to help you when you need help.

Around the time you receive USDA News it will be close to time for the National Convention in Atlanta. I will be having two insurance seminars with, hopefully, a slide presentation about our renewable program. Also, at that time and at our USDA meeting on Wednesday you will be able to meet the new insurance coordinator Pam Kidwell along with her husband Jim from San Diego, CA who will be assuming the position of USDA National Insurance Coordinator at the end of June. After almost 12 years of being responsible for our clubs' insurance needs I am backing out of this position. I have honestly enjoyed the work involved in managing this program. To provide a piece of paper to an insurance chairman and hear the gratitude from the chairman is rewarding in itself. I have made many friendships, mostly over the phone, with some chairmen and have had the pleasure of meeting a few at the conventions. At this point I don't think I will miss the work involved but definitely miss the conversations both on the phone and in e-mails.

I'm glad that I got a year to work with the new renewal portal and I envy Pam Kidwell the years ahead with the Improvements to come and working with Bollinger.

Many blessing to everyone – see you in Atlanta!

### **USDA YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

Each year the United Square Dancers of America – the national dancers' organization – awards a merit-based scholarship to a student in the amounts of \$1000.00 and \$500.00.

### USDA HANDICAPABLE PROGRAM

The USDA Handicapable program is monetary in nature, consisting of allocating monies toward the registration fee for eligible Handicapable dancers to attend the National Square Dance Convention. The only requirement is that they must be a Handicapable dancer and a member of a Handicapable club. Any Handicapable club in the United States may apply for these funds. In order to apply for funds, a club contact person must complete the application form and send it to the USDA Handicapable Committee chairperson

The **YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP** and the **HANDICAPABLE PROGRAM** are two programs where we depend on donations to continue to help these dancers. We are a 501 ©(3) Public Charity, which qualifies for a tax deduction status. Refer to our website www.usda.org for more details on donations and the forms required.

### **Special Report**

### **Keeping Physically Fit**

### George Naas, square dancer from Golden, Colorado, Finishes Frst in Rowing

In the Crossfit games one of the exercises is the marathon row, which is 26miles, 240 yards or 42,500 meters. You could not stop to take bathroom break. You had to row nonstop.

Somebody at a local Crossfit gym came up with the bright idea to see how well the people in his gym could do the marathon row. The news soon spread and about 2,200 Crossfit gyms around the world decided to give it a try. One of the gyms was Crossfit Clout in Lakewood—my gym. I was in the 60-and-up crowd. I thought that I could probably do pretty good, so I gave it a try. My strong suite is that I can push myself beyond what should be my limits. I also knew that I would be going against men who were for the most part between 10 to 16 years younger than me. I just rowed like my life depended on it and closed my eyes so that I would not be looking at how many meters that I was rowing in a specific amount of time.

### DID YOU KNOW...?

("Tech" Tips for promoting your club using the Internet and Social Media) Lane Johnston

.... there's probably a "solution" out there somewhere for every problem we face as square dancers? Sometimes the "solution" already exists but is obscured from view. The fact that a solution already exists for a particular problem just gets lost in the hustle bustle of everyday life...or perhaps a "not in my backyard" attitude prevents a known solution from gaining the traction and attention it deserves.

The "Snowgeddon" that occurred this past month in the Pacific Northwest, resulting in many canceled dance events, highlights the fact that successfully getting the word out to everyone who might be affected by a dance event cancellation is not guided by a well-defined, or easily achieved, policy or process.

You might reasonably conclude....that's a problem! So what's the solution?

"Oh, I know" (says *Problem Solver #1*), "let's post a cancellation notice on Facebook (or Twitter, or Instagram)." Really? Aside from the fact that many dancers (believe it or not) do not have a Facebook (or Twitter, or Instagram) account, many who do (have an account on one or more these platforms) check them infrequently. Many who check their accounts, even frequently, don't have their notifications preferences set in a way that guarantees they'll see a post about a particular dance cancellation they may have planned to attend. Even if a dancer specifically looks for a cancellation notice, there's no guarantee they'll find it quickly, it at all. Does anyone truly believe this approach, alone, is sufficient? How naïve.

Problem Solver #2 takes a different approach. "Let's send a mass email to everyone on our mailing list and ask them to help spread the word." Many of the same problems mentioned above (with Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram) are equally problematic when it comes to email communications. Not every dancer (believe it or not) has an email account. Not every dancer who has an email account checks their email often. Not to mention how annoying it is, for those who do check email often, to receive multiple forwarded emails, and be repeatedly reminded of "cancellations" for dances they did not even plan to attend. How tiresome.

Problem Solver #3 favors posting a notice on their club's website...or was that on their council's website...or maybe it was on the State Federation website...or...perhaps we should just send a notice to any/all of the several grassroots "newsletter" providers in the state. I'm confused already. My head is spinning. The club didn't post its dance in the first place on any (or certainly not all) of the websites or newsletters mentioned...or did they? So why would they bother posting a cancellation now, and on which site(s) would they post it? Could it be posted independently, or would they have to request that a webmaster or newsletter author to intervene and post a notice on their behalf? How complex.

Then, of course, there's always the fallback solution favored by *Problem Solver #4...* just post a notice on the dance hall door stating "Tonight's Dance Is Canceled Due to Inclement Weather". How thoughtful.

The result is an unhappy, chaotic, default approach to scattergun as many of the above "solutions" as one can muster, all at the same time, and hope for the best. How daunting, yet still not very effective. Anecdotal evidence confirms Solution 1, for certain, did not work...and resulted in dancers showing up at an empty parking lot and dark dance hall last week. (And there wasn't even a Solution #4 sign on the door, either). How could we do better?

Consider this Problem Solution (which already exists!) Post all dance events (including dances, workshops, and classes) on the only website currently designed with built-in functionality to deal with cancellation notices. WheresTheDance.com allows you to post events, flyers, and even CANCELLATION NOTICES, independently (that means on your own, without the need of a webmaster to post it for you). Posting a cancellation notice (including posting a reason for said cancellation) takes only seconds to achieve for any authorized representative (anyone who volunteers for a club or council, or is assigned by same, to be a WheresTheDance editor). Dancers do not need to establish an account. Dancers can access the website 24x7 from any platform (desktop PC, tablet, iPad, smartphone). Canceled events don't simply get "deleted" and disappear from the event list. They will, instead, be instantly highlighted on the website with a large, red "CANCELLED" stamp across the face of the original post (so dancers don't have to guess if someone forgot to post the dance in the first place). And dancers wouldn't have to search club or council Facebook, Twitter, Instagram accounts, or personal email account... or club Websites, council websites, or the State Federation website to see if the dance they'd planned to attend is still happening or is canceled. Dancers would only have to go to one place, WheresTheDance.com, and enter two bits of search criteria (the center point of search, e.g. Sumner WA, and a radius around that center, e.g. 50 miles) to see who's got dances scheduled, and which ones (if any) have been canceled. How refreshing.

While it may take "an act of Congress" to get anything done in this country, the author hopes club, council, and State Federation leadership in Washington will take the initiative and necessary steps to accept this solution. Failing that, hopefully the dancers themselves will hold leadership accountable.
