Did you know that September is National Square Dance Month? Colordo celebrates Square Dance Month with a proclamation dance in the state capital and at other areas around the state. Our govenor says he knows how to square dance, but we have never convinced him to join us.

Here is a little history about National and International Square Dance Month - Square dancing was first documented in the 16th century in England and was practiced in France and throughout Europe.

When settlers came to the new world, they brought the dance with them. In the early years of the country there was a mix of dance styles including between black and white people. Many Americans have a notion that square dancing is an activity for old white people. This is not completely true, early forms of square dancing have roots in African American slave communities.


The Western American square dance is likely the most widely known form of square dancing worldwide. This is possibly due to its connection with the 20th century image of the American Cowboy. Since that time, square dancing has undergone considerable development. Yet many countries and regions of the US maintain that square dancing is a folk dance.

Square dancing has been designated as the official state dance in 24 states. In early 1970 efforts were made for a Congressional resolution for September 1970 to be declared as the first National Square Dance Month. However, no evidence has been found that a decision was made. Some sources quote September as International Square Dance month, but I found no evidence that such a proclamation exists.

In any case many people and sources identify September as National Square Dance Month so if you get this issue before September ends, celebrate square dancing. Encourage your friends to try it and have fun. If you miss September, don't worry, November 29th is listed as National Square Dance Day.

USDA INSURANCE COORDINATORS NOTES Elizabeth Sanders

Greetings Everyone,

Did you miss the insurance session at the 72nd NSDC? Not a problem, I will be hosting a Webinar on Saturday, November 11, 2023. The login information for the webinar will be posted on the USDA website (usda.org).

Let's address some problems that have occurred this year.

- 1. Handwritten Checks Please make sure that all the numbers are legible. Apparently, my bank has a problem determining some "4's" from "9's" based on the way some people write them. The closed part of the "4" sometimes looks like a square "9". Not a big deal except when the bank takes \$90 from your account instead of \$40. Some "2's" look like "7's". If you have trouble with penmanship consider on-line banking and have the bank send me a check.
- 2. Insurance portal There is one time during the year when you can delete a facility or a name from the roster and that is the ONLY time that you can delete names and facilities. That time is when you are registering your club for the upcoming year and you are on the portal for the upcoming year. For the 2024 roster you can delete any name that you know will not be a member or anyone that is not sure if they will be dancing in 2024. After you have paid for your club, you cannot delete any names or facilities. That includes any members that passed during the year, left your club for another club or who just stopped dancing.
- 3. Accidents The new rule for 2022 is a dancer is not covered by the USDA insurance before they enter the facility or after they have left the facility. Parking lot accidents are not insured. Tripping over a broken piece of concert in the parking lot should be handled by the facility.
- 4. New or Replacement Certificates You can go into the portal and add new facilities at any time during the year. However, you will have to send me an email letting me know that you need a new certificate. If you have misplaced your certificate DO NOT go into the portal and enter the information again. Send me an email letting me know that you need a replacement certificate.
- 5. 2024 Rate No, I don't have the rate yet. Hopefully by the time of the November USDA Webinar I will know the new rate for 2024. What you can do now is get your clubs to update their rosters and facilities ON PAPER not in the portal. As soon as the insurance company releases the 2024 portal, I will let you know. I expect that to be in November. At that time, I will also be sending all the insurance coordinators new instructions for 2024.

PURPOSE

The United Square Dancers of America – the national dancers' organization – awards merit-based scholarships to students who have shown their dedication to the promotion and perpetuation of the total square dance movement, including square dance, round dance, contra and clogging, and are members of an affiliated club.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

The United Square Dancers of America Founders Memorial Youth Fund expects to award one or more Foundation Scholarships on the basis of merit to high school seniors or college freshmen who are active square, round, contra or clog dancers, and

- Have a record of volunteer service in square dancing, and/or school, sporting or other social organizations such as church, 4-H, FFA, scouting or similar groups.
- Have outstanding leadership potential and communication skills.

CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY Each nominee must:

- Be an active square, round, contra or clogging dancer who is a member of an affiliated club.
- Be a high school senior or college freshman planning to continue their education.
- Submit a Nomination Form signed by the President of the applicant's USDA affiliate organization and;
- Be committed to the promotion and perpetuation of the total square dance movement.

NOMINATION DEADLINE The complete nomination package must be received by February 1.

SELECTION PROCEDURES

A committee will review all nominations and selects the recipient(s) on the basis of

- Extent and quality of service to square, round, contra or clog dancing
- Leadership record for all activities.
- Demonstrated dedication to the promotion and perpetuation of the total square dance movement.
- Future leadership potential, communication skills, and the likelihood of "making a difference" in square dancing.

NOMINATION PROCEDURES

The following items are required for each nominee:

- Completed application.
- Signed nomination form from USDA Affiliate Organization President (download form from USDA website)
- Three letters of recommendation One from your local square dance club of which you are a member, plus two more which can come from representatives of square dance clubs, schools, church, social clubs or long time acquaintances.
- Applicant's essay of approximately 500 words on the subject "The impact square dancing has had on my life."
- If additional space is required additional pages can be attached.

SELECTION ANNOUNCEMENT

The recipient will be announced in June each year at the Annual USDA Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the National Square Dance Convention®.


