## USDA'S Square Dancer Credit Card Program 1989 - 2006

The current USDA Credit Card Program will terminate on July 31,2006. (See news release 2006-02 for details). A brief history of the program follows.

The USDA Board of Directors approved an affinity credit card program in June 1988. The program was initiated in 1989 with all proceeds being returned to USDA Affiliates. The Board of Directors, at the June 1996 Annual Meeting, revised the distribution plan - one half to Affiliates, one quarter each to the Youth and Handicapable Dancer programs.

Funds generated over nearly two decades have provided significant financial support for Youth, Handicapable, and Affiliate Programs nationwide.

The Youth program promotes the introduction of youthful dancers and youth organizations to the square dance activity. Education and training materials are developed and distributed to promote youth square dancing and leadership. A Youth Scholarship program was established with a scholarship awarded annually. Youth after parties are sponsored by USDA at National Conventions. These and other youth programs are currently administered by the USDA Youth Advisors, John & Alitia Becker, Email - usda.youth.advisor@usda.org

The Handicapable Committee is working to further the interaction of handicapable dancer groups throughout the nation, and to achieve interest and recognition of the handicapable dancer as an integral part of the square dance activity. Financial assistance has been on-going to the US Handicapable Association to help with their Convention (East) and to the West Handicapable Convention group. Funds are provided to handicapable clubs to help pay for National Convention registration fees. This program is currently administered by Al & Portia Bruning – Email – usda.handicapable.dancers@usda.org

Affiliates: Affiliates have shared three (3) large distributions of funds to use within their State/Association to promote square dancing including recruiting, publicity, seminars, education, and other expenses.

Additional funds from the Credit Card Program are being held in escrow, pending release by the USDA Board of Directors, as need arises.

The USDA Credit Card Program has provided many tens of thousands of dollars over the years to support these important programs. Its demise is due to the very low enrollments of dancers even with extensive inhouse and bank promotion.

USDA is looking into other sources for a replacement Credit Card. The full support of affiliates and dancers will be needed to convince a bank to enter into an agreement for another Square Dancer Credit Card.

### ARE YOU DANCING UNINSURED

Every square dance organization needs General Liability and Accident Medical Expense coverage while conducting and sponsoring dance activities. As closely as safety rules are followed, accidents can and will happen. This insurance program, especially designed for USDA dance groups, provides Accident Medical insurance, which helps protect club members from financial loss due to a covered accidental bodily injury, and Liability insurance, which protects the club and its members and association officials from financial loss due to unforeseen incidents which may develop into litigation against members and dance organizations.

### LIABILITY INSURANCE

Limits of protection: \$1,000,000 combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence (subject to a \$100 property damage deductible per claim) while participating in scheduled and sponsored dancing activities. \$100,000 limit for damage to premises rented to you.

Who is covered: The club and its members while participating in club or organization sponsored and supervised dancing activities. Liability coverage applies in the United States, its territories or possessions, and Canada.

## ACCIDENT AND MEDICAL INSURANCE

Limits of coverage: \$10,000 Usual and Customary Accident Medical Expense, including Dental \$10,000, Accidental Death Benefit \$10,000, Accidental Dismemberment Benefit (loss of both hands, both feet, sight of both eyes, or any combination thereof), \$5,000 Accidental Dismemberment Benefit (loss of one hand, one foot, sight of one eye).

Note: Coverage is excess to any other valid and collectible medical insurance covering the same accident. Coverage provided for covered medical expenses incurred within 52 weeks of the accident up to \$10,000 for all eligible expenses as stated in the Policy.

Who is covered: Club members will be insured while participating in any regularly scheduled and sponsored dancing activity worldwide, including group travel (10 or more club members) in a vehicle commercially licensed for transportation of passengers and operated by a person holding a valid operators license for such vehicle, while being transported to or from a covered dancing activity.


What is covered: Accidental bodily injury sustained by an insured person while participating in dancing activities sponsored and supervised by a recognized club or organization.

Period of coverage: The insurance year is January 1 through December 31. Coverage becomes effective for individual clubs under the policy on the day the application and premium for insurance is received by the USDA National Insurance Coordinator. There is no pro-rate provision. This is necessary due to the large administrative expense of maintaining different policy dates.

white and blue). Logos are obtained through USDA Dress Chairman. You must supply four (4) white dress panels to imprint. Use any eight (8) gore skirt pattern, twenty-one (21) inch

gore lengths.

BODICE: White bodice insert, white sleeves with white

eyelet trim on sleeves. Red bodice with blue cording on bottom of bodice and between white and red around neck. Blue cording around neck

and between white and red on bodice.

SKIRT: Eight (8) white gores. Alternate panels w/four

(4) logos. Do not place logo in center of back or front. Alternate red and blue cording between gores, placing the blue cording on the left side of the logo panel (as panel faces you). Ruffle: Blue, leaving white material underneath ruffle. Adjust skirt length at waist.

(Pre-cut panels are 25 inches.) Drop ruffle if necessary to lengthen. Zipper: Red - using

white top thread on skirt part.



ACCESSORIES: Complete dress with white petticoat, white pettipants, and red shoes.

MEN: White shirt with one logo embroidered in center back. You can furnish shirt at the same time the four (4) dress panels are printed. Royal blue pants, white belt and shoes, topped off with red tie.


