# USDA INSURANCE COORDINATORS NOTES

Greeting Everyone,

l hope everyone has registered for the  $71^{st}$  NSDCinsurance Saturday, June to be held in Evansville, IN, June 22 - 25, 2022. There will be a session on the 25 at 1pm in Locust Room C. Plan to attend but you need to check the listings at the convention to make sure there has not been a change in time or location.

There are several important hen you can delete a facility and/or a name from the roster and that is the ONLY time that you can delete names and facilities. That time is when you are registering your club for the upcoming year and you are on the portal for the upcoming year which will be 2023. This is when you will verify all the names on the roster as members who will be dancing in 2023. For the 2023 roster you can delete any name that you know will not be a member or anyone that is not sure if they will be dancing in 2023. After you have paid for your club, you <u>cannot</u> delete any names or facilities. Tha includes any members that passed during the year, left your club for another club or who just stopped dancing. So, no deleting from the 2022 rosters.

The next issue is accidents. In the past we have told the clubs that when a dancer arrives at the dance they are covered once they leave their car. But that has changed. According to the insurance company now, the dancer must be in the area where the dance is occurring.

And now to how do you get a replacement certificate or a certificate for a new facility. If you need one for a new facility you should go into the portal and add the facility. Then email me that you need a copy of the new certificate. Or you can send me a request for a new facility and I will add the facility for you. If you have lost your certificates, email me and I will send the certificates to you again. It's that simple.

And now to fill some space here to keep it from being a half page article. Got to come up with something different this quarter. Don't want to bore you with the same story I told last quarter. Oh, you don't remember my story. Well guess you will have to find your issue – hopefully you haven't trashed it yet and read it.

Now that the rush is over, I will be keeping limited hours between now and October 1. Sunday's I am off; emails will be checked Monday thru Saturday and phone calls will be answered between 9am and 5pm Eastern Time Zone. I may not always be at home during those hours but you should leave a message and I will call you back as soon as I can.

There will be dates in June when I will not be available by phone while traveling and attending the 71<sup>st</sup> NSDC. Those dates are June 19 thru 30.

# PAUL SWENSON-BEAVERETON, OREGON

Paul is the newest member of our Centennial club and we are proud to have him join that group. Paul actually turned 100 on September 15, 2021, but we were unable to get together with him to present with this award until January of this year. Former USDA Executive Committee Member, Marilyn Schmit was able to present this to Paul on our behalf.



Paul is not one to sit around thinking about how old he is. Age is just a number. Do what you have always done, just plan on it taking a little longer then it once did. If you don't already have a hobby, get one. You might try helping to build a float for the Rose Parade and riding in it. Pictured here are Paul and his daughter Karen. Growing up Paul loved the Rose parade, but the highlight of the trip was touring the ships in the local shipyard. Paul dreamed of someday being a sailor. And as soon as he graduated from high school Paul joined the Navy. On October 25 the ship he was on and two others were the first to be hit by kamikazes and by





another attack the following day. This one landed about 10 feet from him and should have killed him. They left him for dead, but he survived and gives thanks daily for the gift of life that he was given. Paul Swenson is a true military hero and we could fill the page with his military accomplishments.

Paul returned to his hometown of Portland, OR after the war and did what everyone did during that time period. You got a good job, a good wife, raised a good family, and bought a good house, not necessarily in that order.

Paul and his wife Bonnie loved to square dance and were very active for more than 40 years. They were responsible for establishing the Eager Beaver club in Beaverton, OR. Should you happen to be in Beaverton on a Monday, stop by an dance a tip or two and share a cup of coffee with them. They dance EVERY Monday from 1-3pm. You probably would not have any trouble getting them to share a few stories and tall tales about Paul and Bonnie Swenson.

To celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary they took a cruise through the Panama Canal. For their 70th anniversary they took the same cruise through the Panama Canal, only this time they took their kids. Paul said he wanted them to see something than Oregon, Washington and California. At this point I had to stop and let this one digest in my mind. I never was to much on math and todays new math, well, let's not even go there. But trying to sort this out in my mind I have Paul graduating from high going to serve in the Navy, then coming home and marrying Bonnie. I am guessing they are about 21-22 years old at this point. Add fifty years to that and see if you agree that they are about 71 yeas of age when they take their 50th anniversary cruise. Then they celebrate their 70th anniversary with another cruise through the canal, but this time they take the "kids" with them. I have said this before, but let me remind you that I find humor in most situations and this is no different. My first thoughts were, OMG! Couldn't they find a sitter for a week? There are a couple of questions that are always asked of someone when they reach Paul's age. One of them is "what did you do to reach this age?" What is your secret to longevity? Paul was quick to answer, "I think all those hugs from the square dancers and carrying the mail and square dancing for 40 years, that was exercise without realizing it, so I think that's why I am here,"

Paul Swenson, you are an amazing man and we salute you. Thank you for your military service and for your many years of square dancing and promoting our favorite pastime.
