REGIONAL VICE PRESIDENTS

A. Perform duties assigned by the President, Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee;

B. Maintain a current roster of Affiliates in their regions showing their voting rights, a list of their officers and delegates, with titles, names, addresses, and telephone numbers; sixty days before any meeting of the Board of Directors furnish a copy of this roster to the Secretary; maintain a current file on contacts made with Affiliates;

C. Maintain a current roster of all non-affiliates in their regions showing non-affiliate's names, officer's titles, names, addresses, and telephone numbers; maintain a current file on contacts made with non-affiliates;

D. Serve as coordinators between the USDA President and the Affiliate and Delegates in the regions they serve;

E. Sixty days before the Annual Meeting elections, commence the nomination follow-up procedure specified in the Standing Rules to encourage Affiliates to submit nominations for USDA Officers;

F. Be responsible for promoting USDA membership, purposes, programs, and accomplishments to Affiliates and to non-affiliates;





Californian Tillie Tillman Receives USDA Centennial Award

USDA was honored to present a Centennial Award to 103-year-old Tillie Tillman from the San Jose, California area, on July 23, 2023. Bonnie Abramson, from the USDA Executive Committee, traveled to Tillie's club, the Rockin' Jokers, to present the award. Tillie was escorted to the dance by his daughter, Laurie Andrade. Tillie danced with the club until recently; he still regularly visits the club and welcomes dancers at the door.

Tillie was born in Morgan Hill, California, on October 4, 1919, and moved to San Jose when he was about one. He was the youngest of three children; his two much older sisters were both grown and married while Tillie was still at home. As a child, Tillie enjoyed fishing, hiking, and camping. He was also very interested in electronics and short-wave radio and spent his free time building radios and transmitters from scratch. In 1942, Tillie joined the Navy. He was stationed at the Ferry Building in San Francisco where his job was to check that the radio and radar were working correctly on ships that were in the Bay Area for repairs.

In 1942, after serving only about six months in the Navy, Tillie married his wife Ruth. They were married for 65 years, until Ruth passed away in 2008. Tillie and Ruth had six children – five girls and one boy. The family enjoyed going camping and backpacking together. After his time in the Navy, Tillie went to work at Jennings Radio making vacuum capacitors, before being hired than a year later to work as an electrician with the Ames Research Center in Mountain View. He worked there for 28 years before retiring in 1974.

Tillie and Ruth joined the GT Club (Good Times or Get Together) at the First Methodist Church in San Jose in 1947. The club was started by the minister and his wife, Joyce and Ester Farr. They had no caller, no cuer, and used 78 RPM records. They memorized calls and learned figures such as Grand Square. Members who belonged to other clubs brought back dance patterns to the group. Since – in those days – there were some older ladies in the church who did not approve of dancing in the church, the minister called what they were doing "Folk Games" and the ladies never checked it out!

In 1983, Tillie and Ruth went through a beginner's class at Circle Eights Square Dance Club in Santa Clara,CA. They danced with Circle Eights until the club folded in 1989. They then joined the Rafter Rockers. Tillie served as treasurer for three years. Tillie and Ruth continued dancing with them until they joined with the Jokers to become the Rockin' Jokers. Sometime in the late 1980s or early 1990s, Tillie and Ruth took a round dance class and joined the Rainbow Rounds. In 2009 they joined the Katydids, and served a year as the Membership Chairman.

In 2007, the CPSD (Committee to Promote Square Dancing) was formed and Tillie started dancing as an angel. He managed the first eight years without missing a session! He attended many square dance festivals around the area as well as in Washington State and even BC, Canada. Tillie attended the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association Jubilee every year from 1984 through 1996.

Tillie has been honored by the Rockin' Jokers on his birthday since he was in his 90s.

On October 4, 2023, he turned 104 years old!

The UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC. (USDA) was formed on June 26, 1981, during the National Square Dance Convention held in Seattle, Washington, and has grown to a size that approaches the representation of 250,000 dancers throughout the United States. Promote and perpetuate the total Square Dance movement which includes Square, Round, Contra, Clogging, Line and Heritage Dancing.

Establish a line of communication from the individual dancer to a recognized unified body so that an expression of varied opinions can establish or influence policy for making decisions at the national level.

Provide for education to further the growth and enjoyment of Square Dancing.

Encourage cooperation between member clubs, state associations, councils, federations; national and international organizations; or other groups involved or interested in the promotion of Square Dancing.

Provide a forum for implementing the benefits of membership in the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA and assist members in any way possible. Represent Square Dancing to the general public as a wholesome, enjoyable family-type recreation.

As a "dancers" organization, the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC. serves

to represent the square, round, contra, clogging, line and heritage dancer in decisions which are made at the national level relative to the development and growth of the dance activity. This representation takes place through the various State and Regional organizations affiliating with the USDA. As a united voice, the USDA is able to express the views of the dancers on a national level so that they might be relayed to other national and international groups with whom the dancers interact such as leaders, callers, cuers, instructors, commercial enterprises, other dancers, etc.

Membership is open to any organized nonprofit square dance groups or other groups representing square, round, contra, clogging, line or heritage dancers that will subscribe to the By-Laws, Rules and Policies of the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC. In states which do not have a statewide organization, or when the state organization elects not to join USDA, area or regional organizations may join the USDA to represent the dancers of their state. Applications for membership in USDA are available from any of the USDA officers.

Numerous projects have been specifically undertaken by the USDA to fulfill the organization's goals and objectives and are progressing and expanding very rapidly. Dancers and their organizations, as members of USDA, are afforded the opportunity to participate in the following programs available through the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC.:

An economical Accident and Group Liability Insurance Program is offered for dancers, their clubs and associations. It is the best insurance coverage available in the USA at an unbeatable price.

A "Handicapable" Dancer program has been initiated by USDA to support the Square Dance activities of mentally or physically handicapped or disabled individuals. Association with these dancers has proved them to be most "capable," thus the "Handicapable" title being bestowed on our very special dancers. The Handicapable Program has received the attention and outstanding support of the President of the United States. The USDA is working to further the interaction of handicapable dancer groups throughout the nation and to achieve interest and recognition of the handicapable dancer as in integral part of the Square Dance activity. A Youth Program to promote the introduction of youthful dancers and youth organizations into the Square Dance activity.

An Educational program designed to inform dancers of club leadership and management techniques; the duties and responsibilities of officers, members and callers; data concerning square dance heritage and history; growth; development; and the current trends and activities of the square dance movement. This program includes the preparation and distribution of educational and training literature, conducting educational seminars and panels, and the general sharing of knowledge of leadership experience.

A program to provide a communication loop with the leaders, dancers, dance publications and organizations of the total Square Dance activity. Communications are accomplished by the distribution of USDA news releases and the quarterly publication USDA NEWS.

Display tables and an After Party for all dancers at each National Square Dance Convention.

Other programs may come under USDA consideration for inclusion when their addition enhances the fulfillment of the organization's goals.

The UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of representatives from each affiliate member.
