





Patty's Story

Patricia (Patty) Elizabeth Wilcox May 16, 1944 – December 28, 2023

Patricia ("Patty") Elizabeth Wilcox was born on May 16, 1944, to Robert and Kathleen ("Kay") McGlenn in Cleveland, Ohio. Patty attended grade school and junior high school in Bay Park, Ohio (a suburb of Cleveland). In 1958, after her father died suddenly of a heart attack, Patty's family moved to San Diego, California where Patty attended Clairemont High School and went on



to obtain a teaching degree from San Diego State College (later San Diego State University). Upon graduating in 1967, Patty began a 23-year career as a first-grade teacher at Sequoia and at Walker Elementary Schools, part of the San Diego Unified School District.

In 1982, Patty sought to expand her social life and attended a beginner square dance class with the Single Squares. It was there that Patty met her late husband Walter Dale Wilcox, Sr. On November 12, 1983, Patty and Walt were married. They continued to dance with the Single Squares, joined the UC Saws Square Dance Club in Clairemont, and became active in the Square Dance Association of San Diego County. On July 30, 1992, Walt passed away at the age of 66 from complications of a heart procedure and kidney failure.

Patty's circle of friends encouraged her to continue square dancing. It was at the UC Saws Square Dance Club that she began dancing with Jim Maczko. For 31 years, Patty and Jim danced together and became even more active in the greater square dance world. Jim and Patty were involved at the national level in the establishment and operation of the United Square Dancers of America (USDA), the USA^{West} Square Dance Convention[®], and the Alliance of Round, Traditional and Square-Dance (ARTS-Dance). Patty also attended 32 National Square Dance Conventions[®]. At the state level, Patty and Jim were integral parts of the California Square Dance Council including being elected in May 2023 to a two-year term as Council President and serving on the committee for many California State Square Dance Conventions. Locally, they were actively involved in the San Diego Square Dance Association and served for many years on the committee responsible for the annual San Diego Fiesta. In April 2004 Patty talked Jim into trying to become part of the California Heritage Dancers Exhibition Group – while Jim was reluctant at first, they became enthusiastic members of this group seeking to preserve the heritage of the Square Dance Activity.

On June 15, 2011, Patty suffered a massive heart attack. Jim was able to administer CPR until EMT's arrived and she was taken to UCSD's Emergency Room. On September 1, 2011, Patty had open heart surgery to repair the mitral valve in her heart. This procedure was successful and allowed Patty to live a full life for many more years. However, on December 16, 2023, during an annual visit to Jim's family in Colorado, Patty needed medical attention at the Emergency Room in Colorado Springs, from which she was life-flighted to St. Anthony's Hospital in Lakewood, Colorado near Denver. The cardiology team undertook several diagnostic and medical procedures to try and stabilize Patty's condition. While it seemed she was making progress, she ultimately had to be placed on continuous dialysis and received IV drugs to stimulate her heart. After consultation with Jim and the doctors on December 27, Patty decided to have the artificial support systems removed. She drifted off to sleep early on Thursday morning December 28, 2023.

Patty is survived by her dance partner (and more) Jim Maczko (San Diego), along with his daughter Jill, her husband and their four children; her brother Dr. Robert McGlenn and his wife, and three children; and her stepdaughter Linda Wilcox Pence, her husband and two children.
