Square Dance has seasons but they do not necessarily line up with the Earth's travel around the Sun. For us, Square Dance Summer always starts with the national convention at the end of June. This year the summer opener in Milwaukee was awesome. If you missed it, we urge you to never miss another one. Please get your tickets for Shreveport (2025), Waco (2026), and Loveland (2027) ASAP. These events are sure to be spectacular! The sooner folks get their tickets, the better it is for everyone.

Our Square Dance Summer seems to end with the close of the Tennessee State Convention. It is one of the biggest state conventions, maybe even THE biggest, every year. This year we even had 6 USDA board members at the TN convention. We urge everyone to join us in Gatlinburg, TN each year for this amazing convention. In 2025, TN will celebrate their 50th (July 31st-August 2nd).

Our Square Dance Fall each year starts with Michigan and Alabama on back-to-back weekends in August and ends with Kentucky in September. As of this writing we already had great trips to Michigan and Alabama and are planning our trip to Kentucky. Hopefully, y'all will join us for "SD Fall" next year (tentative dates: Michigan Aug 14-16, Alabama Aug 22-23, Kentucky Sep 4-6)

For example, Grand Square International sponsors a FREE caller school staffed mostly by CALLERLAB accredited coaches during the 4 days prior to every national convention. This year Caller Teaching Program started a new tradition by holding a school staffed by mostly ACA certified instructors during the 5 days after the Tennessee convention. Many state associations have scholarships to help new callers. If you know of any potential callers, we urge you to get them to one of these schools.

#### USDA INSURANCE COORDINATORS NOTES Elizabeth Sanders

#### Greeting Everyone,

I was not able to attend the 73<sup>rd</sup> NSDC due to some unforeseen circumstances. However, I am sure that Pat Inglis did a wonderful job for me. I will be hosting the USDA Webinar on Saturday, November 9, 2024 and will present the same information for those that were not able to attend. The login information for the webinar will be posted to the USDA website (usda.org). Please join me then.

Let's address some problems that have occurred this year.

- 1. Insurance portal There is one time during the year when you can delete a facility or a name from the roster and that is the ONLY time that you can delete names and facilities. That time is when you are registering your club for the first time each year. After you have paid for your club, you cannot delete any names or facilities. That includes any members that passed during the year, left your club for another club or who just stopped dancing.
- 2. New or Replacement Certificates You can go into the portal to add new facilities at any time during the year. However, you will have to send me an email letting me know that you need a new certificate. If you have misplaced your certificate DO NOT go into the portal and enter the information again. Send me an email letting me know that you need a replacement certificate.
- 3. 2025 Rate No, I do not have the rate yet, but tune in at the November USDA Webinar and I am sure I will know the new rate for 2025. What you can do now is get your clubs to update their rosters and facilities ON PAPER not in the portal. As soon as the insurance company releases the 2025 portal, I will let you know. I expect that to be in November. Prior to that I will also be sending all the insurance coordinators new instructions for 2025.

#### CENTENNIAL AWARD Ed and Lynda Willis

The United Square Dancers of America have an award that is presented to dancers who have achieved a "special" milestone. That being reaching the age of 100 years and still active in the square dance world. On July 25, 2024, Petunia City Square Dance Club from Beloit WI held a "surprise" birthday party and dance for one of their members who reached this milestone. Mr. Thomas Stevens turned 100 and the club surprised him with a potluck dinner and dance. As Presidents of the USDA Ellery and Karen Gulbrand along with Jerry and Donna Robey, Executive Committee Members, presented Mr. Stevens with the Certificate and Medallion for the Centennial Award. We were joined by Scott and Brenda Deal, former USDA members and now members of the National Convention Executive Committee. It was an honor to meet this amazing man and to hear stories about him and everything he still does. He joined in several tips of dancing that evening. The following is a bio written by Mr. Stevens daughter and granddaughter.

#### Thomas E Stevens

Born on July 26th, 1924, in a farmhouse near Nelson in Avon, Wisconsin. His birth mother (Marie) and father were not married and not ready to be parents. His father, Chris Hanson, asked his sister Olga, who came from Norway at age 14, if she would help raise Tommy(we believe she was in her early 20's at that time). He was only three months old and was transported in a dresser drawer as his bassinet.

As a young boy Tommy lived in Chicago, as many of his aunts and uncles did, including his dad, Chris. His dad owned a Speakeasy before Prohibition ended. His aunts and uncles ran a fruit and vegetable stand. So, Tommy would walk the neighborhoods with a wagon selling his produce goods. His mother, Marie, would come to visit him every six months to a year to visit him, usually on his birthday. He received a baseball and bat from his mother. Then another year she brought him a model airplane kit, plus an already-made silver plane that his mother's boyfriend made. Well, that started it all, building model airplanes.

At age 15 he moved to Beloit, Wisconsin, with his adopted mother, Olga, and her son Robert. Eventually, He joined the Hanger 13 Flying Club that met at the local YMCA. He had to pay monthly dues of 5 cents, but it included all the modeling he needed. He started working doing paper routes to earn money for his hobby. He worked diligently, getting up early and delivering papers, even in the terribly cold weather. He came down with the mumps and lost most of his hearing in one ear at about age 18.

He graduated from Beloit Senior High School and met his wife, Doris, on a blind date. They had a double wedding with his older brother, Robert, and his wife, Frances. They honeymooned at Lake Ripley in Wisconsin.

He joined the Navy in 1943 and served during WWII. He served on a small tanker ship that had traveled to Pearl Harbor and Saipan and surrounding islands. During this time, they were stationed in Los Angeles. They bought a small hobby shop and lived in the back. His wife ran the hobby shop while he went to watchmaking school. When watchmaking school was over, he enlisted in the Army. Their first child, Susan, was born in 1950. He joined the Army reserves in late 1949, then volunteered for active duty when the Korean War started. At that time, he transferred to Yakima, Washington.

Fortunately, he did not have to travel overseas during the war.

Tommy and Doris made their way back to Beloit around 1952-1953. They lived on Afton Road near Newark Road in a small garage, turned into an apartment.

In 1954 they moved to Janesville. Thomas worked as a machinist for a company called Gilman, which is where he retired from. Their son Eddie was born June 14th, 1956. Around 1956 they started round dancing at a club in South Beloit called the Rhythm Rounds. They decided to start square dancing and joined many clubs in the area throughout the years, including Janesville, Milton, Elkhorn, and Beloit. Square dancing was something they enjoyed for exercise, and it took their minds off the untimely tragic death of their son in 1977 from a motor vehicle accident.

Granddaughters Tamie and Kristie occupied much of their time. They brought them to many square dances throughout the years. His wife of 70 years passed away in 2015. Tom was not done dancing; he continues with square dancing in Beloit on a regular basis when he can get a ride from his daughter, granddaughters, and now his great-granddaughter, Paige. In addition to dancing, he enjoys going to the Senior Center to play ping pong and dance, along with exercising at the Y doing the Silver Sneakers twice a week. He plays ping pong at home with his other great-grandchildren: Amelia, Dennis, and Sawyer.

Tom continues to stay active in his first hobby, model airplanes. He has been a member of Hanger 13 Model Airplane Club since he was 15 and is still a member today. They often meet at Turtle Creek International Airport in Shopiere, Wisconsin.

Family is especially important, and we get together for every birthday and holiday.

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE EDITORS



#### ART AND LILLY HARDIN

Ever wonder what it takes to put on a club level square dance?

Our club does not have a caller, so two years ahead someone must contact the caller, coordinate the schedule, agree on a price, and complete the contract. That person also is responsible for contacting the caller two months ahead to be sure they have the most current information about the time and location.

Although our club has a standard place to dance, we still need to be on the schedule, so one year in advance someone has to contact the community center and set up the schedule. Since we dance at the community center based on each club member paying dues and don't pay for individual events, sometimes, we get bumped. That means that two or three months before the dance someone has to check on the reservation and if we have been bumped from our usual venue has to find an alternate location.

Three months before the dance someone must contact the area council and be sure the correct dance information is included in the quarterly newsletter. Although our little club in the mountains does not get many visitors, we do want to be sure anyone vacationing in the area is invited and has access to the correct information. One or two weeks prior to the dance someone must send out the email invite to all the club members and provide the important information about the dance such as location, caller, and theme.

On the day of the dance someone has to make the refreshments, and someone has to meet the caller and open up the hall. Someone has to set up the tables and chairs and someone has to put up the decorations. Theme dances and decorations to support them are a whole other project.

On the day of the dance, dancers must decide to come, participate and enjoy the dance. After the dance someone must clean up, return the tables and chairs to their appropriate locations and lock the hall.

All this and we haven't touched on how much work the caller does. They need to train, purchase and maintain the sound equipment, prepare for the dance, and travel to the mountains in all kind of weather with various traffic problems. Then they perform for you. The caller may be asked to do an impromptu workshop on a call we are struggling with and is always expected to call to the floor, so everyone has a good time.

After you and your group of someone's do all the work necessary to put the dance on, someone still must keep the club going. Invite and teach new members, plan social events and meetings, take the money and keep things organized. Someone must pay the bills, do the taxes and be sure the organization does not go bankrupt.

How do you do all this? Train, retain and entertain dancers. If you are a dancer reading this, step up, we need your help. If you are a leader, thank you for keeping our activity alive and vibrant.

Have a wonderful fall! Enjoy your new dance classes and continue to help build square dancing.

Hope to see you in a square soon.



#### **Important Information for Treasurers**

One of the overlooked duties of the Treasurer of a nonprofit organization is the essential requirement to file annual reports with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Any entity that has an Employer Identification Number (EIN) also known as a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN), must file one of the annual 990 forms with the IRS. The EIN or TIN are necessary to have a bank account.

Failure to file this annual report with the IRS may result in a entity's EIN / TIN to become inactive and potential loss of nonprofit status.

Form 990 - Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax – available online at: 2023 Form 990 (irs.gov)

Form 990-EZ - Short Form Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax— available online at: 2023 Form 990-EZ (irs.gov)

Form 990-N (e-Postcard) – May be completed online at:

Annual electronic filing requirement for small exempt organizations — Form 990-N (e-Postcard) Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov)

Small tax-exempt organizations generally are eligible to file Form 990-N to satisfy their annual reporting requirement if their annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less.

Form 990-N is easy to complete. The only things needed are these eight items of basic information about your organization.

- Employer identification number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)
- Tax year (calendar or fiscal filer)
- Legal name and mailing address
- Any other names the organization uses
- Name and address of a principal officer
- Website address if the organization has one
- Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less
- · If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business)

Form 990-N is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your entity's tax year. It is not possible to file the e-Postcard until after your entity's tax year ends.

The IRS now offers sign-in options with Login.gov and ID.me. Both offer access to IRS online services with a secure account that protects your privacy.

Login.gov is an account created, maintained, and secured by the U.S. government. ID.me is an account created, maintained, and secured by a technology provider.

Currently, Login.gov can only be used to access IRS Form 990-N (e-Postcard), the Qualified Intermediary Application and Account Management System (QAAMS), the Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act Financial Institution Registration System (FATCA Registration).

#### Our Side of the Mic

An article sponsored by the Denver Area Callers & Cuers Association Bob Riggs ...

#### The Proposal

Many of you may have heard that CALLERLAB, at its annual convention in March, presented what has become known as "The Proposal". I'm sure you would like to know more about this as there are many rumors. Ask you caller, as most of the active callers attended the convention.

The core of "The Proposal" is the suggestion that we reorganize our entry programs for the Square Dance activity into two square dance programs each consisting of 50 calls. The first filling, what today are the promoted as Basic/SSD/Mainstream events and the second filling what today are promoted as Plus events.

The CALLERLAB Board of Governors and its Executive Committee believe this change will eliminate the current confusion between all of our current programs. Currently, CALLERLAB recognizes CDP (25 calls), Basic 1 (32 calls), Basic 2 (+16 calls), SSD (53), Mainstream (+19 calls), Plus (+29 calls), A1 (+50 calls), A2 (+37 calls), and the Challenge lists. All of these are danced in various areas of the world. Here in Colorado we have SSD, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and Challenge classes and dances.

If "The Proposal" is passed next April at CALLERLAB's 50th Anniversary Convention we will have a Square Dance Program and an extended list or Plus program. The determination of what each of these lists will be named and which calls will be included in each will follow the convention.

The benefit appears to be a Square Dance activity that allows new people to easily join the activity in a reasonable period of time and remain as dancers. For those that dance frequently and/or want more challenge the second group of 50 calls would be available by taking additional classes.

This year is a period of communications and discussions to allow our callers and dancers to understand the current situation and help plan a future for our activity.

We encourage you to ask questions, express your concerns and thoughts to your CALLERLAB member callers.
